

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Living in a world marked by hatred, violence, and pain can leave both adults and children feeling disconnected from themselves. Carl Jung described this as alienation from the Self—our inner center of meaning. Sandplay Therapy offers a gentle yet powerful way to return to this center, helping individuals rediscover their truth and restore a sense of purpose. Even one person's healing can ripple outward, bringing compassion, clarity, and hope to the wider world.

Sandplay activates deep transformative energy, creating a still point within life's chaos. We should never underestimate the profound impact of change in a single human being. Barbara's presentation will introduce the Sandplay method, exploring its history, theory, and practice through rich case material that illustrates how healing and psychological growth unfold.

- Understand what Jungian Sandplay Therapy is and how it differs from other sand-based approaches
- Explore the theoretical foundations and historical development of Sandplay
- Explain how Sandplay supports healing, psychological movement, and transformation

- Gain clarity on ethical training pathways for competent practice



DR. BARBARA TURNER


BIOGRAPHY

Barbara Turner began her study of Jungian Sandplay therapy with the founder of the method, Dora M. Kalff, in Switzerland in 1988.

She has done extensive research into the theory and healing process of Sandplay. She focused her doctoral studies on the Sandplay method, writing her dissertation on methods of understanding Sandplay process.

Dr. Turner was instrumental in returning the classic books in Sandplay to print and is the author of what is considered by some to be the authoritative text on Jungian Sandplay, *The Handbook of Sandplay Therapy*, now translated into Korean, Chinese, Russian and Italian. Now available in the **Revised Edition**, with full color photos and searchable index. The *Handbook*, is the most read book on Sandplay around the world. She teaches Sandplay therapy to mental health clinicians internationally and serves as consultant to practicing Sandplay & play therapists.

Dr. Turner has co-authored with Dr. Kristín Unnsteinsdóttir, *Sandplay and Storytelling: The Impact of Imaginative Thinking on Children's Learning and Development*, as well as *Sandtray Play in Education*. She is also the chief editor of *The Routledge International Handbook of Sandplay Therapy*. Dr. Turner is the founder of the **Association for Sandplay Therapy-AST**, the international professional organization dedicated to maintaining the core principles of Sandplay in our work and teaching - clarity, loving kindness & humility.

WORKSHOP 1

MOVING BEYOND DARKNESS:

EXPERIENCING THE SANDPLAY PROCESS

DR BARBARA TURNER

This 2 hour workshop builds on the keynote address by inviting participants to move on from conceptual understanding into direct engagement with the sandplay process. Participants will be guided through the practical foundations of sandplay therapy, and through observation, demonstration and structured experiential exercises the workshop will explore how symbolic material emerges and how the therapist's presence supports the unfolding process. Rich clinical examples will support participants to develop a deeper understanding of sandplay work.

By the end of this workshop, participants will be able to

- Demonstrate a practical understanding of how a Sandplay session is structured and held
- Identify the key elements of safety, containment, and therapeutic presence in Sandplay work
- Observe and reflect on symbolic material
- Recognise patterns and movements within the Sandplay process across different clinical presentations
- Understand the therapist's role in supporting attachment, regulation, and neurodevelopmental integration
- Integrate Sandplay-informed principles into their wider therapeutic practice



WORKSHOP 2

THE TRANSFORMATIONAL POTENTIAL OF DENS AS A THERAPEUTIC TOOL

KATHERINE JACKSON

BIOGRAPHY

Katherine Jackson MA has developed her research into a PTUK accredited CPD course. Her research was published in the international journal of play therapy, and she has presented at conferences including the PTI online conference 2024 and Chichester University's "Childhood, inclusion and society" conference. Katherine has a certificate in relational play and creative therapy young people, and this year commences further training to enable her to work across the age ranges. She loves nature and has a certificate of best practice in outdoor play therapy. She's also a trainee supervisor and has more plans to take her den research to a wider audience.

WORKSHOP DETAILS

The workshop will start with a short presentation of Katherine's den theory. The darkness of the den can be an important factor in working with trauma, danger and threat. The life-death-life cycle can be considered when the den is thought of as from womb to tomb and beyond. The threshold as a process towards growth. Following this there will be three distinct examples of dens in practice.

1. How dens can be part of our personal journey of growth and development (through the use of participatory storytelling)
2. How we might see this when working with our clients (presentation of a case study which demonstrates titration of danger through controllable darkness)
3. A demonstration of dens as a reflective tool (either in supervision or reflective practice)

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- to gain insight into the theory behind the therapeutic use of dens in play therapy
- consider how dens may be oversimplified when described as a "safe space"
- use experiential methods to use dens as a tool for reflection





WORKSHOP 3

WORKING THERAPEUTICALLY WITHIN RESIDENTIAL CHILD CARE.

ROBERT FITZPATRICK

BIOGRAPHY

Robert has 2 areas in which he is very passionate about: 1) Working with children diagnosed with complex learning disabilities, and 2) working with children that have undertaken several forms of difficult transitions, such as moving into the care system.

He started working within Residential Childcare over 20 years ago. Since then, although he has drifted into other fields, this work has always been within sight, present, connecting and drawing him back in. He has held several different positions within this field, including Team Leader, Mental Health Practitioner, and Therapeutic Lead.

He has also worked within Children's Services, with the view of listening to the child's voice and ensuring that this shone through the social workers assessments. He has under-took direct work with children, and often supported young people through difficult transitions... such as coming into care and supporting them until they had a level of stability within their placements. Children's Services have given a greater insight into the legal and policy frameworks surrounding these young people.



WORKSHOP OVERVIEW

Young people in Residential Childcare can be some of the most vulnerable young people in our society. These young people are likely to have experienced multiple forms of Abuse, Trauma, Losses and Bereavements. Many of them have needed to rely on their survival instincts to keep themselves safe, as they have learnt that adults haven't always been there to protect them, or they may have been the ones that have put them at risk (knowingly or unknowingly).

These vulnerable young people may initially be guarded and self-protective, putting up walls around themselves. Interventions need to focus on helping these young people bring these walls down, developing a sense of safety and security, helping the young person to 'connect,' and developing trusting relationships. Within this workshop we will be touching on:

- The young people's historical experiences and the impact of this on their presenting behaviours (through case studies and timelines... considering the potential felt experiences of these life events).
- Systems Theory - identifying with the complexities of this service user group, the family and support system around these young people, considering the 'push and pull' factors, and their potential felt experiences within this system.
- We will start to consider models of Practise in meeting the therapeutic needs of this service user group.
- Adopting a strengths model; considering the young person's creative processes, what they are already tapping into and how we can promote these forms of expressions, identifying the glimpses of magic that seeps through.
- This workshop will be delivered through the use of creative activities, with the aim of guiding your own exploration and understanding of the needs of these young people, developing that deeper empathy.

WORKSHOP 4

AN EXPERIENTIAL INTRODUCTION TO OUT OF THE BOX:

**A PLAYFUL STORIED APPROACH FOR GROUP WORK
AND SUPERVISION.**

JUDY YEOMANS

BIOGRAPHY:

Judy Yeomans is a PTUK registered play therapist and OutoftheBox mentor. She trained as a Speech and Language therapist before taking up voluntary work with churches and church schools advocating for children's spiritual care and nurture. She now works in schools in Sussex, leads retreats and facilitates story circles for women.

The Integrated Holistic model of PT places stories as items in the toolkit that can lead to the use of other media (such as sandtray, painting, or puppets) for the expression of the unconscious and exploration of experiences, thoughts and feelings. OutoftheBox (OoB) is a potential new addition to that toolkit. It offers a holistic approach for supervisees to reflect on learning and personal growth and our child clients a tool to playfully explore the depths of self, leading to the creation of new meaning.

OoB is a novel creative approach, currently used in community groups, therapeutic settings, schools, workplaces and care homes. Using story and play it is process-focussed, facilitating a search for wisdom and wellbeing through the opening of the imagination and the awakening of the soul. Drawing on loose parts theory, Montessori principles, Rogers' and Axline's client-centered approach, Otto Scharmer's Theory U awareness-based change methodology and the Contemplative spiritual tradition, it offers therapists and supervisors an accessible, playful addition to their toolkit that is readily integrated with existing resources. OoB values different ways of knowing for transformation through the use of the body, mind, soul, imagination and heart.





WORKSHOP 5

FINDING OUR VOICE: SINGING, REGULATION, AND CONNECTION IN THERAPEUTIC PRACTICE

CHRISTY DEL STROTHER

This workshop examines the therapeutic use of sound and voice within play therapy practice. Drawing on research into the emotional, physiological and relational benefits of singing, alongside theories of attachment and child development, we will reflect on how music and voice are already present in the playroom. Through discussion, shared reflection, and optional gentle vocal exploration, participants are invited to reconnect with their own embodied experience of sound. No singing experience is required — only curiosity, choice, and a willingness to make sound together.

In this training you will have the opportunity to:

- Understand current research on the benefits of singing and vocal expression relevant to play therapy practice
- Reflect on use of music and voice in the playroom and what feelings it brings up for you as a practitioner
- Share and develop creative strategies for using music and voice in the playroom
- Explore your own relationship with your voice in experiential group singing, focusing on regulation and connection

Christy is a Play Therapist and singer, with 16 years of experience working as a music teacher. She has sung with choirs for over 30 years and has a passion for the benefits of group singing. Through leading singing groups in school and the community, she believes in the power that a shared experience of singing can have and is excited to explore it more in therapeutic practice.




KATE MACAIRT
